

ELKHART -- Bobby Don Kersey, 76, of Elkhart, died 8:50 p.m. Thursday (Jan. 31, 2008) at his residence.

Mr. Kersey was born Oct. 31, 1931, to Albert Kersey Sr. and Nelley M. Rogers in Bee Ranch, Ark. He married M. Elaine Myers April 2, 1978, in Elkhart. She survives.

Surviving is one daughter, Rhanda L. (James) Baroth of Osceola; one son, Allen D. (Patricia) Kersey of Osceola; one brother, Buford (Lorraine) Kersey of Shawnee, Kan.; one half brother, Albert "Junior" Kersey Jr. of Conway, Ark.; two sisters, Laverne Oswalt of Joppa, Md., and Martha (Bobby) Ward of Newport, Ark.; one half-sister, Sarah (Dewayne) Barton of Mercedes, Calif.; two grand-daughters; and several step-grandchildren and step great-grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by four brothers, Dallas, Bealer, James and Hubert; three sisters, Etta May Kersey, Melba Clark and Mary Nell Dowden.

Bobby worked at Skyline Manufacturing for many years but in the 1960s he began working as a bookkeeper and storeroom clerk for the Indiana Toll Road, from which he retired in 1994 after 23 years.

He was a member of the Osceola American Legion Post 308 and a member of the Michiana Mustang Club, where he met his wife, Elaine. He enjoyed football and basketball and was an avid Arkansas Razorbacks fan. He also liked to attend home church groups with his wife, feed the ducks near his home, and spend time with his cat, Tinker.

He was a veteran of the Korean War, where he served in the US Navy for five years as a radio operator. After the war, he remained in the Navy Reserves for more than 20 years.


