Ford Mustang likely to get EcoBoost

It seems inevitable that Ford's mighty Mustang is going to get an EcoBoost engine.

That's what product chief Derrick Kuzak said on Monday night at an event following the first day of the Detroit auto show, more than hinting that the iconic pony car has EcoBoost ethos on the horizon.

"That would probably be a very safe bet at some point in the near future," he said.

Kuzak didn't specify which engine could wind up under the hood of the Mustang, though EcoBoost is offered in four- and six-cylinder variants in the United States. The most powerful V6 version makes 365 hp, and it's sold in the Taurus SHO and the F150.

EcoBoost in the Mustang has been a long, relatively open rumor around Ford for years, and execs have always maintained that the technology would become commonly used throughout most of its lineup, though never pinpointing the 'Stang.

Ford just updated the car for the 2013 model year, increasing the GT to 420 hp and upping the Shelby GT500 to an eye-popping 650 hp with a 200-mph-plus top speed.

Sales of the car dipped slightly in 2011 to 70,438 units, down slightly from a tally of 73,716 in 2010. Chevrolet sold 88,249 copies of the Camaro last year, handily beating out the Mustang.



Shelby sprinkles on the gold for its 50th anniversary

Shelby American is celebrating its 50th anniversary with a few special-edition cars in limited numbers. Only 50 white copies and 50 black copies of the car will be available.

"Few thought that Shelby American would make it in the car business for 50 years," Carroll Shelby said in a statement. "We built the first Cobra in a rented garage, then the GT350s in an old hangar. But our company is still here, manufacturing the best cars I've ever made."

The special editions--unveiled Tuesday at the Detroit auto show--will have gold stripes to commemorate the company's golden anniversary. Additionally, each car gets 50th-anniversary badges, custom interiors, special wheels, six-piston Wilwood front brakes, a car cover and a unique VIN that will be entered in the official Shelby registry. Museum delivery is also included at the Shelby factory in Las Vegas.

The GT500 anniversary model is offered with 650 hp, 750 hp or 800 hp in coupe and convertible body styles. Shelby enhances the production Ford Mustang's brakes and suspension and updates the styling. All of the black and white cars will wear gold stripes, which Shelby says will be a one-year option. The anniversary package for the GT500 will cost \$59,995, not including the cost of a donor car.

The GT350 will also get an anniversary makeover. Based on the 5.0-liter GT Ford Mustang, the GT350 can be upgraded to 525 hp or 624 hp. Shelby adds Le Mans -style stripes, bigger brakes and suspension bits to sharpen the pony car. The GT350 is offered both as a coupe and convertible. An automatic transmission will be offered on the lowest of the three upgrade packages; bigger-horsepower cars have manuals only. The GT350 anniversary package begins at \$59,995, plus the cost of a donor car.

The GTS upgrade costs a bit less at \$19,995 and can be added to both the GT and V6 Mustangs. For that price, Shelby upgrades the brakes, suspension, tune and appearance.

"A 50-year anniversary only comes around once in a life," Shelby American president John Luft said. "These limited-edition Shelbys will mark that milestone for a select few who have a chance to own a piece of history."

Who we are (2012)

For the last couple of years I've made an analysis of our club roster. People seemed to find it interesting, so I've updated the information using the December 2011 roster. The demographic information uses the addresses given by the members.

We listed 99 members at the

end of the year. Of these, 86 had Indiana addresses, 11 lived in Michigan, one is in Arizona, and one was from Ohio.
