Eating With a Fork Once Considered Scandalous

Forks were first used in the Middle Ages, but eating with one was considered scandalous. In the 11th Century, when a Greek princess died shortly after introducing forks at her wedding with a Venetian Doge (chief magistrate) Domenico Selvo, it was perceived as divine punishment.

While forks were a regular feature on the tables of nobles in Italy since the 11th Century, and used in France in the 14th Century, it was introduced in England only in 1611 by Thomas Coryat through his book "Coryat's Curdities Hastily gobbled up in Five Months Travels in France, Savoy, Italy, &c." Even then, he was mocked about promoting the use of forks and called "Furcifer," meaning fork-bearer.

The upper classes of Spain were using forks in the 16th Century, as could be told from a large assortment of forks that were recovered from the wreck of La Girona, which sank off the coast of Ireland in 1588. In 1630, Governor Winthrop of Massachusetts had the first and only fork in colonial America.

So what did people eat with before using forks? They used wooden spoons, knifes and, of course, their hands.

Forks, mostly being two-tined, were known as "split spoons". Although there are examples of four- and five -tined forks from the before the 1600s, the four-tined fork became popular only in the late 1800s.

(Now, don't you feel more educated? Just another service provided here...)

2012 Ford Mustang Shelby GTS, an AW Flash Drive



The Shelby GTS package adds \$9,995 to the cost of your V6 Mustang.

What is it?

The 2012 Shelby GTS is an "entry-level" performance and appearance upgrade package for both V6- and V8-powered Ford Mustangs. We got a chance to drive the 305-hp, 3.7-liter V6 model right before Shelby packed it up and sent it off to New York for its world premiere.

The \$9,995 GTS package includes upgraded springs, shocks and tuned stabilizer bars, Shelby/Baer upgraded front and rear brakes, a Shelby/Borla sport exhaust system, a unique "deep draw" hood, a black billet grille with "running pony" emblem, lower front fascia, racing stripes, assorted badges and a Shelby CSM serialized build plaque.

What is it like to drive?

We got to drive a silver V6 automatic coupe with black stripes and optional 18-inch wheels. The burly hood and lower fascia with gaping air intake impart the intended muscular look to distance it from the typical low roller V6 Mustang. The husky grumble of the Borla exhaust further enhances the muscle-car image, but it does hit a sour note when an aggravating "boom" occurs while cruising at 1,500 rpm to 1,800 rpm.

We also were not too keen on the sluggish response of the stock automatic transmission unless you have the throttle pinned to the floor. Manually shifting or engaging the "hill descent" mode solves this problem.

The suspension mods are a noticeable improvement over the stock setup. The ride is firmer than stock,

eliminating much of the wallowing and body lean. It's not as stiff as the GT350, but it's a nice balance between comfort and handling. Despite some understeer, the GTS feels much more responsive and nimble when cornering than the stock Mustang.

Do I want it?

If you're a Shelby fan looking for an affordable but official Shelby entered in the company's registry, this is your admission ticket. Rising gasoline prices make the V6 Shelby's 31-mpg highway rating appealing to anyone looking for American muscle-car looks, reasonable performance and decent fuel economy.

If gasoline prices drop or you want more speed, Shelby has a ProCharger supercharger available that will get 475 hp from the V6.

Ford to sell Mustang Boss 302 as a crate engine

In an about-face from information given at the February launch of the 2012 Ford Mustang Boss 302, Ford said on Friday that the high-revving, naturally aspirated 5.0-liter V8 will be sold as a crate engine through Ford Racing Performance Parts.

With a redline of 7,500 rpm, part No. M-6007-M50B produces 444 hp and 380 lb-ft torque with features such as CNC ported cylinder heads, forged pistons and "runners in box" composite intake manifold.

Here are the details on the crate engine:

- -- 11.0:1 compression ratio.
- -- Lightweight aluminum cylinder block with crossbolted main bearing caps and thick main bearing bulkheads for bottom-end strength.
- -- Large-sump 8.5-quart oil pan with revised oil-pan baffling for improved oil control under hard cornering.
- -- Revised composite intake system with shorter runners, inspired by Ford Racing's Daytona Prototype engine program.
- -- 80-millimeter, single-bore "drive by wire" throttle body.
- -- High-strength aluminum-alloy cylinder heads with fully CNC-machined ports and chambers for exceptional high-rpm airflow without sacrificing low-speed torque.
- -- Sodium-filled exhaust valves for improved heat dissipation.
- -- Forged-aluminum pistons and upgraded sinterforged connecting rods for improved strength.
- -- Vehicle wire harness and power control module are not included.




