



Ford Model A foundation makes funding push to get museum launched

More than 4 million copies of the Ford Model A were produced from 1927 through 1931. As the Model T's acclaimed successor, it evolved into nine different body styles.

More than 80 years later, there are more than 100,000 Model As said to still be out there, but owners and early collectors are thinning out. The Model A Ford Foundation sees this as a critical time to construct a permanent facility dedicated to preserving the Model A era.

There is an effort to build a museum at the Gilmore <u>Car</u> Museum in Hickory Corners, Mich., but the foundation is short of funds needed to complete the project.

So far, the organization has raised \$700,000 of the \$900,000 needed to build the museum. It's confident that a groundbreaking on the Gilmore campus is feasible for spring 2012--if enthusiasts are willing to help. The Gilmore campus hosts various collections along with its own, such as the Classic Car Club of America Museum.

Owners and Model A lovers can support the effort to bring the Model A Ford Museum to the Gilmore campus. In addition to making a cash donation, engraved bricks for the museum walkway are available for donors to commemorate the Model A, with space for a 60character message on each brick. Ford lowers Sync price



Sync will be a \$295 option on most Ford vehicles.

Ford is cutting the price of its Sync software, the company said on Monday. The price will drop from \$395 to \$295, and Sync will be available on base trim levels for the first time.

The new pricing rolls out on the 2012 Ford Explorer and Ford Edge base models.

Sync is quite popular with Ford buyers. On the Edge and the Explorer, the current take rate is more than 80 percent. With the lower price, Ford expects that rate to grow to 95 percent.

"Our customers love it and recommend it, and our dealers want it in more products," said Ken Czubay, Ford vice president of U.S. marketing, sales and service. "Sync already has brought hands-free, voiceactivated in-car connectivity to millions, helping keep drivers' eyes on the road and hands on the wheel."

The base features of Sync include hands-free, voiceactivated phone dialing and voice control of USB music devices; 911 Assist, the automated emergency calling service, and an on-demand vehicle health report. Customers who choose the base package will also be offered a Sync Services subscription that offers turn-byturn directions, traffic reports and business information with live operator assistance.

During the next three years, the automaker will introduce the new Sync pricing across its entire North American Ford lineup.



Conservator Award to Schmidts




Jim and June Schmidt are the Club's first winners of the MCA's Conservator Award.
